Nine Marks of a Healthy Church Expositional Preaching 2 Timothy 4:1-5

Back in the 1990s, the concept of church growth became very popular. Pastors began writing books about how their church grew and the methods they used to increase the attractiveness of their Sunday morning gatherings. Many Southern Baptists began embracing a theology of church growth that focused on catering to the sociological dynamics of large group gatherings. The underlying supposition to the whole church growth movement was very simple: healthy churches grow.

- 1. Preach the Word because Christ is coming.
- 2. Preach the Word because we need sound doctrine.
- 3. Preach the Word because only it evangelizes.

Expositional preaching is not boring doctrinal lectures. At least it shouldn't be. It is preaching that is laser-focused in God's Word, engages doctrinal truth at various levels, and eventually calls people to repentance and issues an invitation to conversion. Jesus said, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." He didn't just say go preach. He told us what to preach. We are to preach the gospel. What is the source of our understanding of the gospel? It is God's Word.
